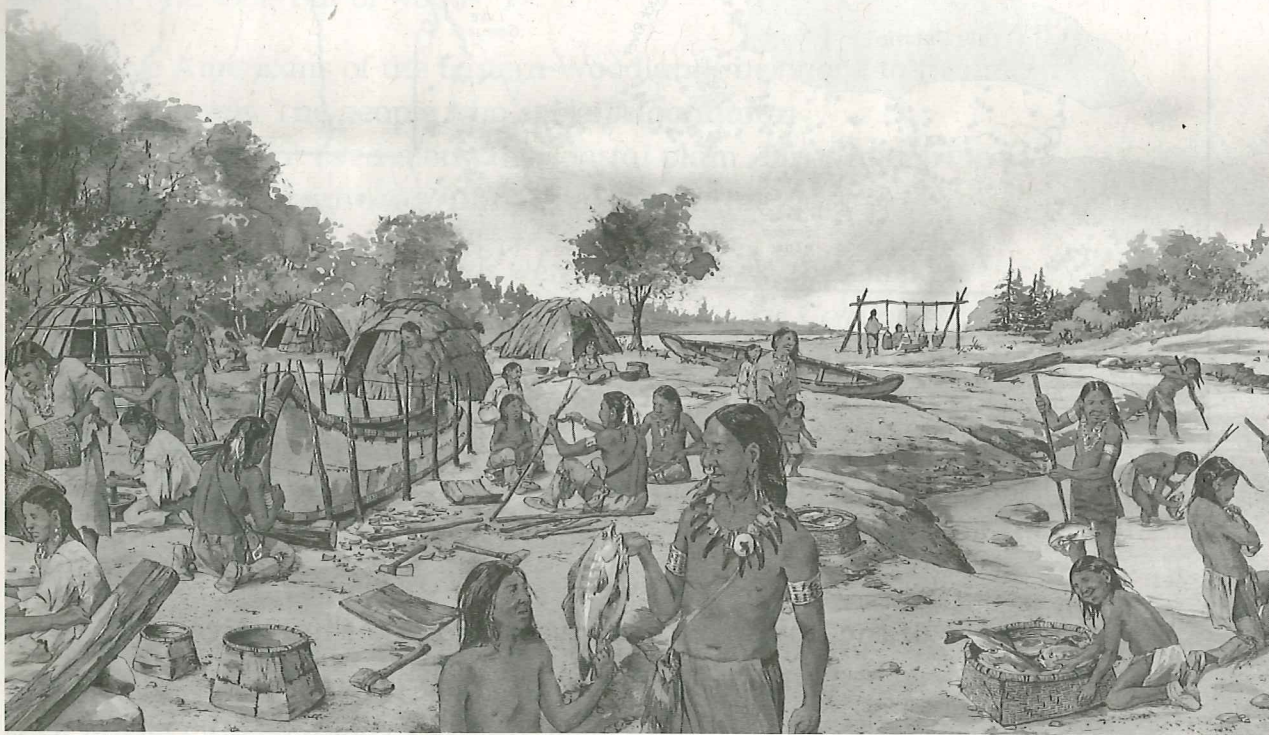


# 1.9 Native American Economies

**Saturday October 13, 1492**

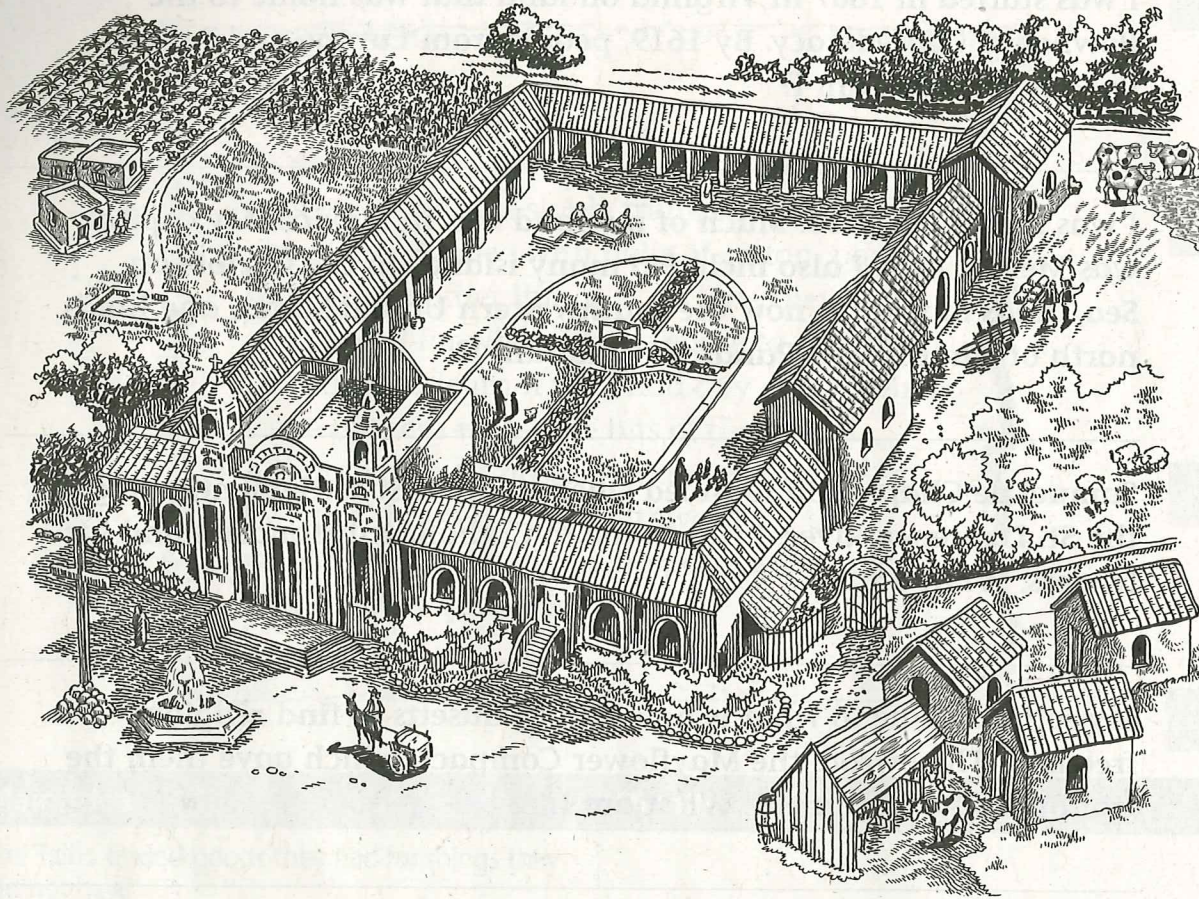

These they exchanged for whatever we chose to give them. I . . . tried to learn if they had any gold. Seeing some of them with little bits of this metal hanging at their noses, I gathered from them by signs that by going southward . . . there would be found a king who possessed . . . gold, and in great quantities.

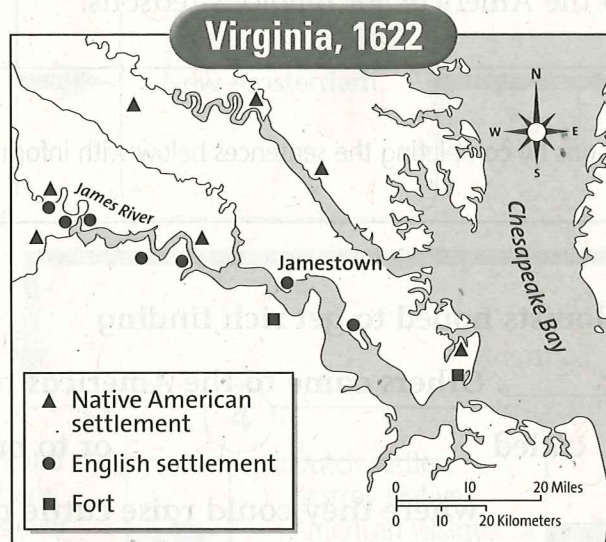
