Proper Nouns

A **proper noun** names a particular person, place, or thing. Begin the first word and every other important word in a proper noun with a capital letter. All other nouns are **common nouns**. Common nouns are not capitalized.

Common nouns: scientist, school, country

Proper nouns: Dr. Mark E. Shen, Pace College, United States of America
