

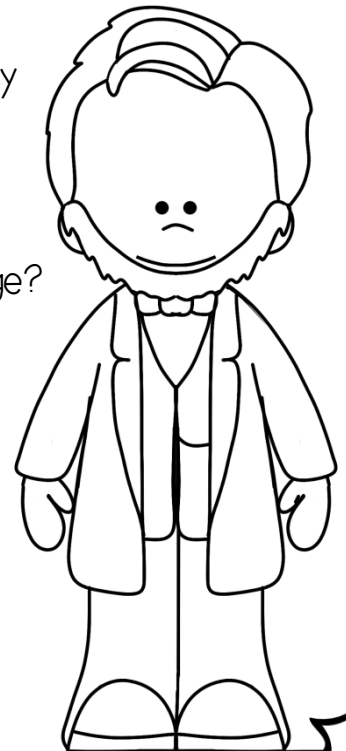
Abraham Lincoln

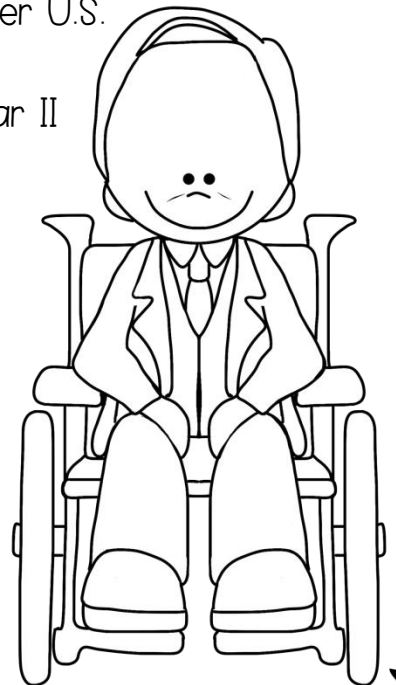
Franklin D. Roosevelt

By the end of that third term, Roosevelt was tired and was dealing with health problems. However, he still had big plans for the country's future. He ran for a fourth term in 1944 and won again! Sadly, he did not see the end of that term; he died in 1945.
