

The Bill of Rights

Amendment 1	Freedom of religion, freedom of speech, freedom of the press, freedom of assembly, and freedom to petition grievances (complaints or wrongs).
Amendment 2	The right to bear arms (own a gun).
Amendment 3	In peacetime, citizens will never have to keep soldiers in their homes without their consent (permission).
Amendment 4	Protects citizens from improper searches of their bodies, possessions, or homes. It requires that a detailed warrant be issued by a judge listing what can be searched.
