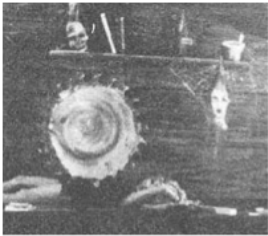


The Wildwood Whacky Shack

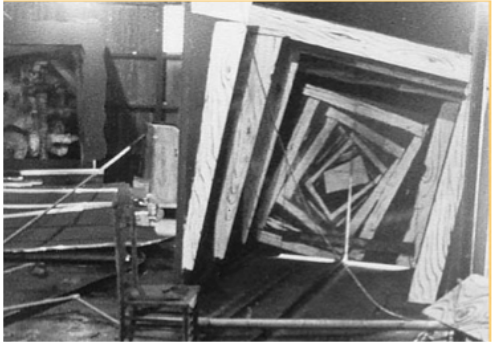
